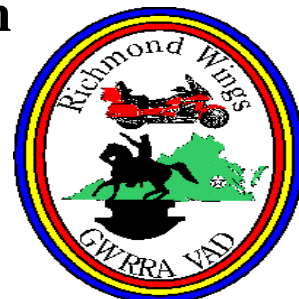

Flournoy in your thoughts and prayers as he continues to recover from his very serious injuries. I consider Steve one of my best friends and when he is hurt I am hurt.

Rather than dwell on this event I want to point out a few miracles that happened that day. First of all riding in our group were Lester and Kelly Critton. When Kelly saw the injuries and the severity of the injuries, her nursing training and experience went into high gear immediately. I consider that it was meant to be that she was on that ride that day.

Passing us going the other direction when the accident occurred was a group of 85 bikes from the South Richmond Hog Group. They are called Steel Horse Hog. They immediately stopped and began to assist in so many ways that we cannot thank them enough for all they did. In their group were also two nurses. I know the name of the one but not the other. Jolie jumped right in to assist Kelly in administrating immediate care to Steve. I consider all three of these fine people angels that without a doubt took control of a very serious condition and allowed Steve the opportunity to be transported to MCV and receive further medical attention. In addition Diane has said that Jolie visits with them regularly in the hospital. She continues to check up on Steve. Debbie and I will always be thankful for the efforts of these three nurses. Thank you from the bottom of our hearts.

In addition to the three nurses that jumped right in, the GWRRA riders that were on the ride and all of the HOG members began to assist the other accident victims. For such a chaotic event, everyone reacted in a very professional, controlled manner. It was obvious that many of the HOG members and most of our GWRRA group as well had taken the proper training for handling such an event.

The folks that were on that ride will never forget that day or we will forget the magnificent assistance that was given to us all. The Powhatan County EMS folks were fabulous, the fire department was fabulous, and the State Police and local law enforcement folks that responded were fabulous. Debbie and I wish we knew all the names of all those people that came to our assistance that day. We would like to hug every last one of them and thank them for what they did.

It is time to put this day behind us and move forward. I am convinced that friends make the healing process go so much faster and better. This is a very special group we have here at GWRRA.

Thanks for all your help during the year.



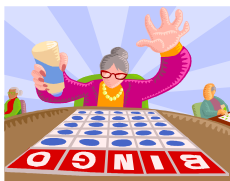

THE COOK'S CORNER by Debbie Bonham

ROSE'S FAMOUS CHEESECAKE

6 Graham crackers, crushed
1 Cup plus 3 T sugar, divided
3 T margarine, melted
5 Pkg Cream Cheese
3 T flour

1 T vanilla

1 Cup sour cream

4 eggs

Heat oven to 325 degrees. Line 9 x 13 pan with foil. Mix crumbs, 3 T sugar, and margarine. Press onto bottom of pan. Bake 10 minutes.

Beat cream cheese, remaining sugar, flour, and vanilla with mixer until blended. Add sour cream, mix well. Add eggs, 1 at a time, mixing on low speed after each just until blended. Pour over crust.

Bake 40 minutes or until center is almost set. Cool completely. Refrigerate 4 hours.

VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY -- CHAPTER

An Act to amend and reenact § [46.2-833](#) of the Code of Virginia, relating to traffic lights.

[H 1981]

Approved

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That § [46.2-833](#) of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:

§ [46.2-833](#). Traffic lights; penalty.

A. Signals by traffic lights shall be as follows:

Steady red indicates that moving traffic shall stop and remain stopped as long as the red signal is shown, except in the direction indicated by a lighted green arrow.

Green indicates the traffic shall move in the direction of the signal and remain in motion as long as the green signal is given, except that such traffic shall yield to other vehicles and pedestrians lawfully within the intersection.

Steady amber indicates that a change is about to be made in the direction of the moving of traffic. When the amber signal is shown, traffic which has not already entered the intersection, including the crosswalks, shall stop if it is not reasonably safe to continue, but traffic which has already entered the intersection shall continue to move until the intersection has been cleared. The amber signal is a warning that the steady red signal is imminent.

Flashing red indicates that traffic shall stop before entering an intersection.

Flashing amber indicates that traffic may proceed through the intersection or past such signal with reasonable care under the circumstances.

B. *Notwithstanding any other provision of law, if a driver of a motorcycle or moped or a bicycle rider approaches an intersection that is controlled by a traffic light, the driver or rider may proceed through the intersection on a steady red light only if the driver or rider (i) comes to a full and complete stop at the intersection for two complete cycles of the traffic light or for two minutes, whichever is shorter, (ii) exercises due care as provided by law, (iii) otherwise treats the traffic control device as a stop sign, (iv) determines that it is safe to proceed, and (v) yields the right of way to the driver of any vehicle approaching on such other highway from either direction.*

C. If the traffic lights controlling an intersection are out of service because of a power failure or other event that prevents the giving of signals by the traffic lights, the drivers of vehicles approaching such an intersection shall proceed as though such intersection were controlled by a stop sign on all approaches. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to: intersections controlled by portable stop signs, intersections with law-enforcement officers or other authorized persons directing traffic, or intersections controlled by traffic lights displaying flashing red or flashing amber lights as provided in subsection A.

€ D. The driver of any motor vehicle may be detained or arrested for a violation of this section if the detaining law-enforcement officer is in uniform, displays his badge of authority, and (i) has observed the violation or (ii) has received a message by radio or other wireless telecommunication device from another law-enforcement officer who observed the violation. In the case of a person being detained or arrested based on a radio message, the message shall be sent immediately after the violation is observed, and the observing officer shall furnish the license number or other positive identification of the vehicle to the detaining officer.

Violation of any provision of this section shall constitute a traffic infraction punishable by a fine of no more than \$350.



Is it Spring Yet? By Jim Sharkey and Billy Russell

I don't know about you but I am ready for some nice weather. I am normally a year round rider but I haven't been on the Wing since mid-November. I haven't gone without riding for this long since I have owned Gold Wings. For my mental health I need to go for a ride soon as I am starting to get cranky.

The real point I am trying to make here is I want to make sure that when I am able to start riding again I go about it in a smart and safe manner. I know our co riders are concerned that we will go back to riding too soon but I have given this a lot of thought. Let me share with you what I have come up with.

1. **Make sure the Wing is ready to ride.** A few things I will be paying special attention to here are:

Tires and Wheels——Condition of tires (i.e. weathering); Air pressure; Bearings and seals

Controls——Smooth operation of clutch and brakes.

Lights——Condition (make sure no lens are cracked and etc); Working order

Oil——Check all fluid levels (brakes, clutch, final drive, radiator) -- I will change oil and filter before taking the Wing out.

Chassis——Condition (cracks at gussets and accessory mounts) -- Make sure the handle bars move smoothly from stop to stop.

Kickstand—————Make sure both are not bent and cracked.
& **Side stand** Make sure both operate smoothly and apply lubrication if needed.

Wow, you know what? The above looks just like a **T-CLOCK**.

2. **Make sure that I am ready to ride.** I need to make sure that my legs are ready to support the Wing. I plan on starting off with short rides in optimum weather. I will go to a nearby parking lot and practice my braking and swerving skills. I believe I will start out with about 30 minutes sessions and slowly work my way up to longer rides. I think it will probably take me a week or so to get to the point where I can start riding into work. Additionally, since I haven't been on a bike in so long I will have to make sure that I get into the Motorcyclist's frame of mind and make sure my Rider Radar is fully functional. Bottom line is we all want to make sure that every time we ride, our bikes and ourselves are ready to roll. If it's been a while since you have ridden maybe a little extra attention to the details would be in order.

Well that's enough for now.

Ride Safe – Ride Aware Billy Russell



After the Chapter D Motorcycle Accident on New Year's Day we need to keep the following folks in our thoughts and prayers.

Steve Flournoy was seriously injured in the accident when he was hit from behind. He was in a coma for about a week and is now slowly recovering at MCV Hospital and will be undergoing some surgery to fix a broken leg/knee and possibly 8 broken ribs.

Debbie Bonham who was thrown from her bike had 3 ribs broken and a punctured lung is now recovering after an overnight stay at Chippenham Hospital. Her lung has healed and the broken ribs are still causing a great deal of pain for her. She is still under doctor's care.

Marty Link was thrown from his trike and received road rash, cuts and bruises galore. He had a minor problem with brain bleeding because of a medication he is currently taking. He was hospitalized at Johnston Willis Hospital for 3 days and is at home recovering.

Lawanna Link was in MCV for bruises, cuts, and also brain bleeding due to her medications. They kept her there for a few days to observe her and she was released after a few days and is at home recovering. Let's keep all these folks in your hearts, thoughts and prayers for a complete and swift recovery.

2009- Asst. Chapter Directors

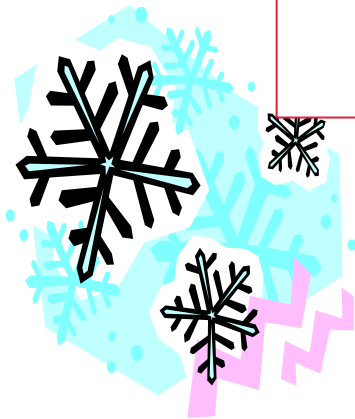
Chapter D 2010- Activities - Coordinators for Rally in the Valley and Wingless Weekend
